Doctor, businesswoman to serve on ArtCenter Board

Tequesta, Fla. — (June 1, 2011) – A Harvard-educated dermatologist, Dr. Elise Hillmann, and Lyn Ianuzzi, a former New York businesswoman who is active in various community projects, have joined the Lighthouse ArtCenter Board of Directors. They will help guide the not-for-profit Museum and School of Art which serves the community through its various artistic endeavors.

“I couldn’t ask for two more qualified community members to be a part of the Board,” said Lighthouse ArtCenter Executive Director Katie Deits.

Dr. Hillmann is an alumna of Harvard College with a medical doctorate from Washington University School of Medicine in St. Louis and carries triple board certification. Her solo medical practice in Jupiter specializes in Age Management Medicine, Dermatology and Dermatopathology.

Lyn Ianuzzi was born and raised in the New York Metropolitan Area and attended St. Peters College in Englewood Cliffs, N.J. She had a lengthy business career in fashion and hospitality in Manhattan, including working for Madison Square Garden, Hilton Hotels, Jacob Javits Convention Center and trade show businesses, such as the National Board Show and Cosmo Expo/PrimePack.

Both Hillmann and Ianuzzi have been involved with the Lighthouse ArtCenter for several years, and each has also obtained leadership experience with other not-for-profit organizations.

Dr. Hillmann has been a member-student of the ArtCenter for 10 years, taking instruction in the media of watercolor, pastels and acrylics. She was former Chairperson of the Pink and White Ball for the Jupiter Medical Center and 2010 sponsor of Dominos Cat Rescue League, Palm City.

Ianuzzi began her service to the Lighthouse ArtCenter as a docent and since has served on various event committees, including taking the role as chair of the ArtyBras event. For seven years, she was a board member of the Jupiter Island Residents Association and was liaison for the Association serving on the town’s Beautification Committee. She is also a regular committee member of the Jupiter Medical Center’s Pink and White Ball, for which she co-chaired with husband Ralph Ianuzzi in 2009. Additionally, Ianuzzi is a member of the Jupiter Island Garden Club and the Loxahatchee Guild.

The Lighthouse ArtCenter Museum and School of Art is a member-supported not-for-profit 501(c)(3) community arts organization, providing excellence in art exhibitions, instruction, education and outreach for all ages.
