

READING RAINBOW

The Lighthouse ArtCenter in Tequesta is inviting readers and artists of all ages to get hands-on with its summer art show. "Full S.T.E.A.M. Ahead," on view June 4 to August 11, is an interactive exhibit with an art camp component. The center's 3,500-square-

foot gallery will welcome 100 artworks by five Caldecott Award-winning children's authors and illustrators, including Judy Schachner and Mary GrandPré. The exhibition is open to the public, and all visitors will have the opportunity to participate in the creation of a site-specific community art installation. Concurrently, students in the supplemental camp will utilize science, technology, engineering, art, and math (the subject components of S.T.E.A.M.) in their quest to make works inspired by the exhibit. The camp can host children ages 6 to 12 and will cover traditional mediums, such as clay and paint, as well as computer-based media. (561-746-3101, lighthousearts.org)

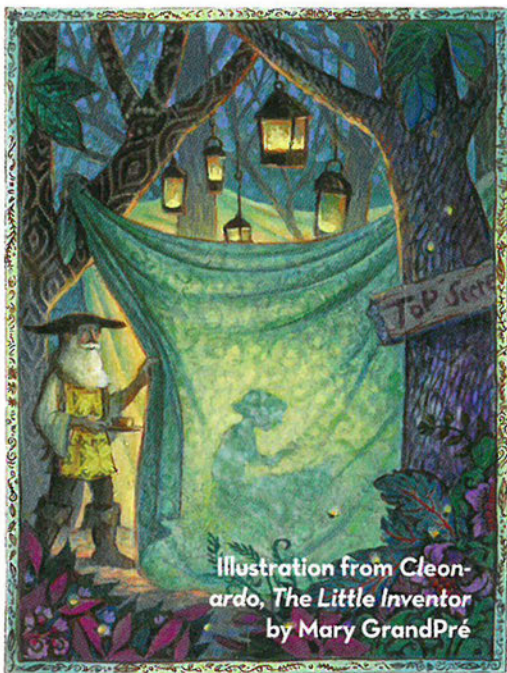


Illustration from Cleonardo, *The Little Inventor* by Mary GrandPré
